
SUBJECT: Minutes of 26 Oct 00 Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) Meeting



1. Place: 27th Civil Engineer Squadron Conference Room
2. Time: 7 p.m.

5. Ms. Armstrong welcomed all members to the RAB and turned the RAB over to Mr. John Pike for his briefing.
6. Mr. Pike distributed the agenda to all present and gave a quick explanation of what would be covered in the RAB meeting. The first topic of the agenda would be the required portion regarding the Class Three Permit Modification request. This is a requirement that the public have the opportunity to comment on the Class 3 Permit modification. Comment sheets were made available to all present. Mr. Pike briefed that Cannon AFB has submitted various sites for proposed no further action. There are three volumes for public review and comment. The three volumes are also located at the Clovis public library.
7. Mr. Pike explained the no further action proposals on 66 sites that are sufficiently characterized for consideration for removal from the permit. These particular sites include oil/water separators, landfills, underground storage tanks and fire training areas. He explained to the members what a fire training area was. Ms. Armstrong raised the question if all known documented sites exposing any hazard have been identified? Mr. Pike felt very confident that all sites have been investigated and researched so no hazard was found.

8. Mr. Pike explained to the members the list of the miscellaneous units pertaining to the permit modification. The DP-33 drum disposal site was the very first closure for Cannon AFB. It received its approval for closure from the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED).
9. Mr. Pike addressed the actions taken to justify this closure of these sites. He stated that all units have been investigated and sampled according to required screening levels. The sites in question have been cleaned up to meet all acceptable levels under the EPA guidelines.
10. All members were informed that the public comment period would continue through 11 Nov 00. If any interested party would like to review or comment on these proposals, they should direct their comments to the Hazardous Waste Bureau of the NMED. Mr. Pike gave the names of the point of contacts regarding this permit modification. Those individuals are Sanford Hutsell of Cannon AFB and Mr. Glen von Gonten of NMED.
11. The RAB members were given a restoration update on several sites: Fire Training Area 4, Sewage Lagoons, Site SD-11, Melrose Range and Landfill 25.
 - a. Fire Training Area 4: A corrective measures study (CMS) will be conducted on this site. Foster Wheeler Corporation will accomplish the CMS.
 - b. Sewage Lagoons: Awaiting final CMS on this site.
 - c. Site SD-11: A history of this site was given to the members. Report is currently being finalized and will be sent to NMED.
 - d. Melrose Range: Headquarters Air Combat Command ordered an investigation to determine the extent of unexploded ordnances on all ranges. Cannon conducted a preliminary assessment consisting of records search and interviews to determine what ordnances were used. At the present time, awaiting the assessment report from the Corp of Engineers.
 - e. Landfill 25: Contractor began work on this site on 25 Sep 00. The concrete rubble will be crushed for use as fill elsewhere on the base. Filling the low spots and saving larger trees will improve the appearance of this site. There are various possibilities for this site at a later time.
12. Ms. Armstrong suggested that the next RAB meeting be set in January 2001 and the location to be determined. Members will be notified via mail of the next RAB meeting.
13. Ms. Armstrong thanked all visitors for coming out and Col Bowen for his support and attendance. Meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
