Hi Pat,

I agree that the volatile organic compounds (VOCs) are fairly minor and that a complete vapor intrusion scenario is not needed. However, unless the soil that had historical detections of VOCs have been removed, they can not be omitted from the final risk screening analysis used to determine whether the site meets the criteria for "complete without control". Thus, I agree that the risk screening should be revised to include all historical detections of all metals and organics determined to be constituents of potential concern. This would include metals above background and historical VOC data and all other organics.

Hi Pat,

I have a couple of questions for you concerning this site.

1. In your summary letter (thank you - very helpful), you indicated that the sand trap, OWS and bypass conduit were removed in 4/13/03 (via telephone communication with Hugh Hanson 5/25/10). In looking at the data for VOCs, most of the detections were in shallow surface soil (0-1 ft bgs) directly below the wash pad. Was the wash pad and soil underneath part of the removal action? To what depth did they removal soil?
2. The next question is that in the latest round of sampling, it appears that they only looked at PAHs. Did they sample for VOCs and they were all non-detect?

I think it boils down to what did they remove and what analytes were included in the "confirmation" sampling. I am still a little concerned about VOCs mostly because that what NFA – which could mean construction of a building in the future.


I am going to be out of the office June 3-7. Maybe we can discuss when we are both back sometime next week?
