History, Size, and Nature of Business: Grant Mid-Continent took over this facility in 1995 from Texaco employing 2 people on 7 1/2 acres for bulk storage of gasoline and diesel fuel products and further truck loading and distribution. Only hazardous waste generation is from cleaning tank bottoms from 9 above-ground product tanks, 3 co-ming tanks for retaining off-spec products for recycling and 6 underground tanks (one is out of service and another is pending AQ permit to replace one going out of service). There are 2 additional ASTs for additives.

As a result of the operational walk-through, we described the secondary containment system including bentonite beneath the ground, above the 2' water table, and the railroad unloading system and the transport loading station.
