1. This Directorate finally received your letter of January 14, 2002, on Friday January 18, 2002, after it worked its way through our higher headquarters. I am attaching another copy of our "Delegation of Authority" signed by the USAADACENFB Commanding General, Stanley E. Green, designating the Director of Environment, to receive this type of correspondence. Sending correspondence from your Department directly to me will allow us to respond in a more rapid manner.
2. The purpose of this memorandum is to respond in writing as you requested in your January 14<sup>th</sup> letter concerning our choice of how to proceed with our NFA petition for these six sites.
3. Our choice is to proceed with the NFA approval process on all six sites. We do not feel it is appropriate to delay the recognition that there is no requirement for further corrective environmental action on the two wastewater ponds over a long standing disagreement of the regulatory status of these ponds.
4. However, if we must decide between proceeding with four sites or no sites Fort Bliss would request that the NFA approval process proceed with the four sites.


