





INTRODUCTION

1.0 INTRODUCTION

This Community Relations Plan (CRP) was prepared for Holloman Air Force Base (AFB) by Ebasco Services under contract to the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). This CRP provides a strategy which Holloman AFB (Holloman, or the base) will use to promote and enhance communication with the public about its cleanup and restoration efforts and their environmental implications.

Two major regulatory programs direct environmental activities at Holloman AFB. These are the Air Force's Installation Restoration Program (IRP) and the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) corrective action program.

The IRP, mandated under the Superfund Amendment and Reauthorization Act (SARA) amendments to the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) and developed by the Department of Defense (DOD), identifies and evaluates past hazardous material disposal sites on DOD property, including Holloman AFB. By design, the program controls the migration of hazardous contaminants and controls hazards to health or welfare that may result from past disposal operations or practices. The IRP consists of four phases: identification, investigation, cleanup, and closeout. Holloman entered into the Air Force's IRP in 1983 by conducting the IRP Phase I Records Search (CH2M Hill, 1983).

The RCRA corrective action program was initiated in 1984 by the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) to RCRA. The purpose of this program is to determine if hazardous waste or hazardous constituents have been released to the environment from waste management units. The program evaluates remedial options and follows through with remedial actions if a release is found. The Air Force performs RCRA facilities investigations (RFIs), corrective measures studies (CMSs), and corrective measures implementation (CMI) in accordance with the RCRA corrective action program. In September 1991, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region 6 issued Holloman AFB the HSWA portion of their RCRA operating permit. The HSWA portions of the permit required that sites identified by the EPA during a 1987 RCRA facility assessment (RFA) be included in the RFI.

As appropriate, the base must comply with the IRP and RCRA corrective action program. Both are similarly phased and ultimately intended to ensure that contaminated sites that pose a threat to human health or the environment are remediated. Since its HSWA permit was issued, Holloman AFB has integrated the two programs to reduce duplicative efforts. this approach has been embraced by EPA Region 6 and the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED).

1.1 OBJECTIVE

Holloman AFB is among three Air Combat Command (ACC) Air Force bases selected to participate in the Air Force Accelerated Cleanup Program (ACP). Holloman was selected due to its proactive remediation style and its partnering efforts with EPA and NMED.

In compliance with EPA guidance, Holloman AFB is committed to promoting a dialog between the community, the Base, and the NMED. This CRP has been prepared to assist Holloman AFB in achieving this goal. The purpose of this CRP is to outline the ways in which Holloman AFB will:

- Provide the public with the opportunity to express comments and give input to technical decisions
- Inform the public of planned or ongoing actions
- Identify and resolve conflict

One of the main objectives of this CRP is to assess the concerns of the community about planned and on-going studies at the base, including all phases of the cleanup activities. The CRP also strives to identify how and when the public would like to be involved in the decision-making process. The CRP clearly outlines the key issues which the public has expressed regarding contamination at the base. It establishes procedures for accurate and timely release of information to potentially affected and interested citizen groups, elected officials, public interest groups, agency officials, and the media. The CRP also establishes methods to facilitate communication between the Air Force and the community at large.

The CRP reflects current community concerns. In order to stay current, the CRP will be periodically updated as community concerns develop or change over time.

1.2 ORGANIZATION OF THE PLAN

This CRP is organized into six sections including this introduction (Section 1). Section 2 provides background information about Holloman AFB and the IRP and RCRA corrective action programs. Background information about the community in which the base is located and with which it interacts is presented in Section 3. Section 4 provides the information gathered as a result of interviews with community members and summarizes their concerns about the IRP and RCRA corrective action program. Section 5 presents highlights of the community relations plan, including its objectives and goals, the CRP resources, identification of areas of sensitivity, and key mechanisms for community involvement. Section 6 provides a schedule of community relations activities.

SITE BACKGROUND

2.0 SITE BACKGROUND




Figure 2-1. Location of Holloman AFB, Alamogordo, New Mexico

Holloman AFB covers approximately 58,410 acres in Otero County, in south-central New Mexico, about 75 miles north-northeast of El Paso, Texas (Figure 2-1). The nearest residential and commercial area is the City of Alamogordo, located seven miles east of Holloman AFB. The base is bordered on the south by Highway 70. Dry washes border the eastern and southern portions of the base. White Sands National Monument lies to the west. The base lies near the center of a flat desert area of the Tularosa Basin, an internally drained depression between the Sacramento Mountains on the east and the San Andres Mountains on the west.

Lost River crosses the base from northeast to southwest. Although it is normally dry, it occasionally flows in a gorge about 25 feet deep and several hundred feet wide. The topography of the base is relatively flat, with subtle sloping in a southwest direction ranging from a 4,125-foot elevation at the northeast corner to a 4,050-foot elevation at the southwest corner. The soils at Holloman AFB are caliche-base and lack external drainage. Storm water tends to collect in small depressions in and about the base though rainfall generally evaporates quickly. Terrain in the general vicinity varies considerably, from pine-covered mountain areas, to isolated buttes, large tracts of flat desert, gypsum sand dunes, level beds, and dry lake beds.

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


Figure 2-2. Holloman AFB Satellite Facilities

Holloman also operates several off-base satellite installations. These include the Silver City Radar Site; the El Paso Radar Site (inactive); the Boles and San Andres Well Field Area; and Bonito Lake (Figure 2-2).

2.1 HISTORY OF HOLLOWMAN AFB

Holloman AFB, formerly Alamogordo Army Air Field, began as a temporary facility constructed on open range during World War II. The airfield was deactivated for a brief period following the end of the war.

In March 1947, the Air Field was transferred to the Air Material Command. At this time, the base mission was to “provide facilities and accomplish development and testing of pilotless aircraft, guided missiles, and allied equipment in support of the Air Material Command Research and Development Program.” In support of this mission, quantities of petroleum, oils, lubricants, solvents, and protective coatings have been used, resulting in the generation of wastes at the base.

Holloman AFB was placed under the guidance of the Air Force Missile Test Center following the formation in 1951 of the Air Research and Development Command. In 1952, the base was named one of the development centers of the Air Research and Training Development Command and became Holloman Air Development Center. In 1957, the base was designated as the Air Force Missile Development Center under the Air Force Systems Command (AFSC).

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The 49th Tactical Fighter Wing assumed host responsibilities at the base on January 1, 1971 when the base was transferred from AFSC to the Tactical Air Command (TAC). In 1977, the 479th Tactical Training Wing was assigned to Holloman AFB. In 1980, the 833rd Air Division was reactivated and became operational at the base. TAC organizations at Holloman included the 49th Tactical Fighter Wing, the 479th Tactical Training Wing, and the 449th Mobility Support Squadron.

In November 1991, the 833rd Air Division was deactivated and replaced by the 49th Fighter Wing. The 49th Fighter Wing continues to provide leadership for the base. Holloman AFB was transferred from the TAC to the ACC on June 1, 1992.

Approximately 27 tenant organizations occupy the base. Several contractors also operate facilities at Holloman AFB.

2.2 RESPONSIBILITY FOR HOLLOMAN AFB

Holloman AFB retains ownership of the IRP and RCRA corrective action program and performs all work through 49 CES/CEV. HQ ACC/CEVC at Langley Air Force Base, Virginia provides programmatic direction and helps establish goals for funding and closure of sites.

2.3 ENVIRONMENTAL RESTORATION PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The IRP identifies and evaluates past hazardous material disposal sites on DOD property. This DOD program is designed to control the migration of hazardous contaminants and control hazards to health or welfare that may result from past disposal operations or practices. The IRP consists of four phases: identification, investigation, cleanup, and closeout.

Holloman AFB has summarized its environmental restoration program in a document entitled the Management Action Plan (MAP). This document is one of the items available for review by the public at the designated information repository (see Section 5.2). Information presented in the following sections (Sections 2.3.1 - 2.3.4) was derived from the MAP (February 1995) and from Holloman AFB's Installation Restoration Program Update (January 1995).

2.3.1 Waste Generating Processes

Various activities at Holloman AFB have contributed to the generation and disposal of wastes. Activities such as vehicle maintenance and cleaning, aircraft maintenance and cleaning, aircraft corrosion control, fire training, munitions burning, and landfill operations have all had some role in generating waste. Typical waste materials at Holloman AFB include engine oils, lubricating oils, waste fuels, hydraulic and transmission fluids, paints, and spent solvents.

Prior to 1969, these wastes were burned during fire department training exercises. Between 1969 and 1979, wastes were transported to the petroleum, oil, and lubricants (POL) Drum Storage Area for disposal. From 1979 to the present, waste oils, hydraulic and transmission fluids, and waste cleaners have been stored in color-coded drums. Wastes were then either reused or disposed of according to RCRA guidelines.

2.3.2 IRP and RCRA Corrective Action Program Site Activities

The base is not currently on the National Priorities List (NPL) as defined according to CERCLA/SARA. Holloman AFB's site WP49, the sewage lagoons, is currently covered under a Federal Facilities Compliance Agreement (FFCA). Holloman AFB contains 60 IRP sites at various stages of the IRP process, including 37 sites designated as closed.

A Phase I records search was conducted in August 1983. As a result of the 1983 records search, the Air Force decided to investigate several Holloman AFB sites, thus initiating the IRP. A RFA for the U.S. EPA Region VI was conducted in 1987. This review of the base's Solid Waste Management Units (SWMUs) led EPA Region 6 to direct that a number of such units and Areas of Concern (AOC) be evaluated for releases of contaminants to the environment.

Holloman AFB contains 56 IRP sites and two AOCs on Base and four IRP sites off-base. The IRP sites are summarized in Table 1 of Appendix C. To date, the status of Holloman AFB's IRP sites is as follows:

Approximately one-half of the sites in the RI/FS phase are not expected to need further action. The conduct of additional RI work at most of the sites satisfies regulatory concerns about the extent of contamination in the groundwater. Sites that do not need further actions will be addressed as sites to be closed out in accordance with United States Air Force (USAF) policies.

Most of the IRP sites at Holloman AFB are SWMUs. Their closure is specified in the HSWA portion of Holloman's RCRA permit.

Holloman AFB contains 113 HSWA SWMUs. These are described in Table 2 of Appendix C. There are other active SWMUs at the base; however, they are not currently included in the corrective action program. The status of the SWMUs is as follows:

The August 1983 Phase I records search indicated that 43 sites had been identified as hazardous or potentially hazardous. As of 1994, 17 sites have been added to the list as a result of further studies and discoveries.

Compliance activities are being conducted at Holloman AFB concurrently with environmental restoration activities under the IRP. Compliance activities address the RCRA corrective action program, underground storage tanks (USTs), hazardous materials management, and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs). Other compliance activities at the base include: hazardous materials management at the Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office (DRMO) permitted under RCRA Subtitle C; closure of sewage lagoons regulated under the FFCA and RCRA 40 CFR 264; PCB disposal in accordance with the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) and EPA PCB policy; and closure of the main base landfill, a RCRA Subtitle D municipal solid waste site.

2.3.3 Site Descriptions

A summary of all IRP and RCRA corrective action program sites identified at Holloman AFB may be found in Appendix C. Table 1 is the IRP Site Summary, Table 2 is a list of HSWA SWMUs, and Table 3 is the Removal Action Status list.

2.3.4 Nature of Potential Threat to Health and the Environment

No imminent threat to public health has been identified as a result of past or current activities at Holloman AFB, although soil and groundwater have been affected by releases from fuel spills, USTs, wastes generated from landfills, ordnance disposal, and other practices associated with an operated military facility. Holloman AFB is committed to preventing future releases, controlling known releases, and studying, selecting, and implementing remedial actions at the base.

COMMUNITY BACKGROUND

3.0 COMMUNITY BACKGROUND

This section presents a profile of the community surrounding Holloman AFB. It also describes the community's interest in base activities, and discusses community concerns about potential risks posed by the base.

3.1 COMMUNITY PROFILE

Holloman AFB is located approximately seven miles west of the City of Alamogordo, in Otero County, in south-central New Mexico. Alamogordo grew to become the trade center for area livestock and agriculture since its founding in 1898. Alamogordo is also an important recreation area. Tourists are attracted to the city due to its proximity (14 miles) to White Sands National Monument. White Sands Missile Range, site of the first test of the Atomic Bomb on July 16, 1945, is a major tourist attraction. The city's population has increased from 3,000 in 1940 to over 30,000 in 1990. Also part of the community are the approximately 1,300 families who reside on Holloman AFB proper.

The community and Holloman AFB have had a close, positive relationship since the base's activation in 1942. As a predominant local employer, Holloman AFB maintains significant economic ties with the City of Alamogordo. The base employs over 1,300 civilians and 4,600 military personnel.

3.2 CRP COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Holloman AFB has been involved with the community in a variety of ways. The base participates actively in local events and sports activities, conducts base tours, sponsors an annual base open house known as Community Appreciation Day, and supports the local schools in various ways such as through a Science Advisor Program. The base provides speakers to various downtown engagements. The base even provides equipment for civic events such as the annual Christmas parade. Historically, Alamogordo and Otero County have strongly supported the base. In addition, the base Commanding Officer and Executive Officer attend meetings of the Alamogordo City Council and the local Chamber of Commerce.

Holloman AFB is held in high esteem by the local community. Discussions with local stakeholders revealed little negative opinion about Holloman's activities in general or specifically about the effects of their activities on the environment. Local stakeholders are known to speak out vehemently when there are local environmental issues to which they have objections. There has been no activism expressed by stakeholders with regard to Holloman AFB activities. Some local stakeholders indicated that community turnout at public meetings sponsored by Holloman to discuss the IRP and RCRA corrective action program is generally light because people do not feel personally affected by the environmental issues associated with Holloman's activities. Holloman is viewed as a good neighbor and an important contributor to the economic health of Alamogordo. Holloman AFB's credibility in the community is high.

Stakeholders interviewed for this CRP did not express a strong desire to be involved in decision-making at Holloman with regard to environmental issues. They generally indicated that public meetings may not be the best way to reach the local stakeholders, though they seemed not to be aware of many of the issues or of past efforts which Holloman has made at getting the public involved. They indicated that an increase in the amount of information made available through media such as the local newspapers, radio, and television would help increase the level of community awareness and consequently would increase the level of community involvement.

3.3 COMMUNITY CONCERNS

In general, the primary environmental concerns of the community focus on the quantity and quality of available water, air quality, and soil integrity. However, in discussions with stakeholders, these concerns were rarely couched with specific reference to Holloman AFB's activities.

COMMUNITY INTERVIEWS AND CONCERNS

4.0 COMMUNITY INTERVIEWS AND CONCERNS

4.1 COMMUNITY INTERVIEWS

In preparation for this CRP, an effort was made to discuss community concerns with a variety of stakeholders, including current Alamogordo residents, current Holloman AFB employees, current locally elected officials, and representatives from local regulating agencies.

Interviews were conducted by telephone by Ebasco Services personnel. These conversations revolved around several themes:

- The environmental concerns which community members share with regard to activities at Holloman AFB
- The degree of awareness the community members have about Holloman AFB's IRP and RCRA corrective action program
- Identification of the best methods for communicating with the local community

Information elicited from these stakeholders is summarized herein. The information is organized according to the above-noted themes.

4.1.1 Environmental Concerns Shared by the Community

Interviewees did not express strong collective environmental concern. They all agreed that issues about the quality and quantity of available water, air quality and soil integrity were important, but few had complaints or comments specific to Holloman AFB. This was reflected in conversations with both local residents and individuals with regulatory responsibility who indicated that they receive few complaints from locals about the base. Interviewees commented that they rarely saw published letters to the editors of the local newspapers regarding community views on Holloman AFB cleanup activities.

Several interviewees talked about the environment in relation to air flights associated with Holloman AFB. One stakeholder noted that in instances where plane crashes resulted in releases of hazardous fuels, the Holloman AFB personnel were thorough and fast in their cleanup of released materials and debris. Another stakeholder recommended that Holloman provide a protocol for how to direct the public in cases of plane crashes which occur off-base. He recommended that this be provided to the police, firefighters, and county and community officials within communities along Holloman's various flight paths.

One regulator reported receiving complaints about the smell from release of sewage effluent to Lake Stinky. However, she indicated that the base has since taken steps to correct this.

All of the interviewees agreed that overall, Holloman AFB and Alamogordo have a positive, productive relationship. The community invests a good deal of trust in Holloman and assumes that their activities are in keeping with acceptable environmental standards.

4.1.2 Community's Awareness of Holloman AFB's IRP and RCRA Corrective Action Program

Non-regulator interviewees have little specific awareness of Holloman's IRP and RCRA corrective action program. Most did not express a desire to attend public meetings about the subject. One interviewee reported that in his opinion, most stakeholders do not have the technical sophistication to understand the implications of much of the information made available through the information repositories. This person suggested that the Town of Alamogordo should appoint a Technical Review Committee comprised of people with appropriate technical and environmental backgrounds to represent Alamogordo on the Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) and participate in decision-making about environmental activities.

Several stakeholders expressed the idea that further use should be made of the local newspaper and possibly of radio and television. They expressed a desire to read more articles reporting on Holloman's IRP and RCRA corrective action program. Radio and newspaper personnel did not feel that they received an abundance of news releases from Holloman AFB about environmental issues. They indicated that they would welcome receipt of such items so that they could determine if they were newsworthy and thus possibly present the information to the public.

Persons living on the base also feel a need to be better informed about Holloman's IRP and RCRA corrective action program and how these activities may affect them. One regulator expressed a concern that this part of the Holloman AFB community was not fully incorporated into the communication process. He indicated that there is a need for a greater effort to inform base residents about areas where, for instance, children should not be allowed to play because of environmental hazards, etc. Base resident-interviewees indicated that they trusted and depended on the information disseminated to them by the Wing Commander and assumed that they were told everything that they needed to know, especially with regard to personal safety. However, discussions with several residents indicated that they were unfamiliar with specific details of the IRP and RCRA corrective action program.

4.1.3 Identification of Best Methods of Communication with Community

Holloman AFB personnel working on the IRP and RCRA corrective action program have expressed frustration at not getting more community members involved in community-oriented activities which address the IRP and RCRA corrective action program. Specifically, they have not been successful at attracting many community members to

public meetings or to fill available seats on the RAB. Some stakeholders indicated that they would attend meetings if they felt personally affected by an issue.

Stakeholders interviewed indicated that they depend most on written material as their key source of information. Media vehicles such as newspapers are an important channel for disseminating information to the Holloman AFB community.

4.2 COMMUNITY CONCERNS

Stakeholders interviewed expressed some concerns directly associated with Holloman AFB, which are summarized below.

- Stakeholders desire access to technical information translated into lay terms.
- There is a need to provide more information to the residents at Holloman AFB with regard to both personal safety (e.g., keeping children from playing at certain locales on the base) and the IRP and RCRA corrective action program.
- There is a need to provide an appropriate protocol to police, firefighters, and the public who respond at the scenes of off-base airplane crash sites.
- Holloman base residents desire additional information and education about such issues as recycling; asbestos (in houses); lead base paints; appropriate disposal of opened containers of household cleaning substances (especially when packing up to change residences or bases); and appropriate disposal of spent motor oil.
- Holloman AFB needs to be concerned about potential future land use.
- Action is needed to address affects of leaking underground storage tanks (USTs).
- Occasional odors from Lake Stinky need to be addressed.

General environmental issues expressed during interviews focused on water quality and quantity and air quality. Groundwater beneath Holloman AFB has been designated as unfit for human consumption on the basis of New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission regulations. The groundwater has been designated as a Class III B aquifer according to EPA guidance due to total dissolved solids concentrations in excess of 10,000 mg/L. The aquifer is not considered a source of drinking water; however, some residents in Alamogordo utilize groundwater after they treat it for their use. Air quality is governed by the NMED and Holloman AFB monitors its air discharges in accordance with a permit issued by the State.

4.3 SUMMARY

Holloman AFB enjoys good standing in the community. Stakeholders view Holloman as a good neighbor and an integral part of the community.

Holloman AFB's excellent reputation will only be enhanced by its continuing efforts to inform the public about its environmental activities at the base. Holloman should continue to enlist help from the local media and to cultivate relationships with various members of the community. Holloman's proactive approach of publicizing IRP and RCRA corrective action program activities will reinforce the community's positive view of the base.

5.0 COMMUNITY RELATIONS PLAN HIGHLIGHTS

5.1 CRP OBJECTIVES AND GOALS

Holloman AFB is committed to maintaining meaningful two-way communication between the base and the community. To achieve this, Holloman AFB will continue to implement several community relations activities to both inform the public and encourage community feedback. These activities (described in greater detail in Section 5.2) are intended to address concerns identified in Section 4.2 and to provide on-going updates about installation restoration activities:

- Maintain and expand a mailing list
- Maintain and update the information repository
- Develop and distribute news releases, fact sheets, and public service announcements
- Support the RAB
- Conduct community meetings

5.2 CRP RESOURCES

The following community relations activities are supported by Holloman AFB to address the public's interest in IRP and RCRA corrective action program activities at the base. The schedule for these activities is presented in Section 6.0.

5.2.1 Mailing List

Holloman AFB has a mailing list of interested parties who have participated in the RAB meetings and who have regularly received information from the base about the IRP and RCRA corrective action program (Appendix A). This list should be expanded to include a greater number of community residents. The mailing list will be updated to include other interested parties who wish to receive updates. Sign-up sheets for interested parties who would like to be included on the mailing list will be provided at the public repositories. Fact sheets, which should be available at numerous public locations if inserted into the Sunburst, will have a mail-in response form that will enable residents to be put on Holloman AFB's mailing list.

5.2.2 Information Repository

An information repository has been established at the Alamogordo Public Library. The repository currently contains over 800 documents available for review (see Appendix E). The repository will be updated as additional information related to the IRP and RCRA corrective action program activities at Holloman becomes available.

Fact sheets will be developed as appropriate and will be distributed to those on the mailing list. Public Service Announcements will be made through the media when appropriate. Appendix D contains the complete News Media List.

5.2.4 Restoration Advisory Board (RAB)

The RAB meets twice a year. It provides opportunities for community involvement, participation, consultation, and advice. It provides a framework for establishing a partnership between the Air Force, the regulatory agencies, and other stakeholders, resulting in more efficient, cost-effective and focused approaches to environmental restoration. The RAB at Holloman AFB is conducted in an open format to allow participation from interested parties, including natural resource trustees, local residents, and other federal agency representatives. Regulatory officials currently involved in remediation at the installation are requested to participate, as well as base group commanders, base public affairs officials, service center and contractor representatives, and base judge advocate officials. Currently, the RAB is co-chaired by Holloman's Wing Commander Col. Bruce Carlson, 49th FW Commander, and Mayor Dan King (Mayor of Alamogordo).

5.2.5 Community Meetings

Holloman AFB has held community meetings in the past to inform the public and encourage community involvement. Community meetings will be held at key technical milestones during IRP and RCRA corrective action program activities. The purpose of the meetings is to provide the community with information about restoration activities and give them the opportunity to provide the base with comments. Future meeting dates and locations will be prominently displayed in local newspapers and through other public media.

5.3 AREAS OF SENSITIVITY

The environmental issues with which the Holloman AFB community is most concerned are water quality and quantity and air quality. The community does not view Holloman AFB as a threat to these environmental resources.

5.4 KEY COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Holloman AFB has made a number of efforts to involve community members in the IRP and RCRA corrective action program decision-making process. However, a greater effort is needed to reach additional community members. This will require that Holloman AFB make IRP and RCRA corrective action program information more accessible to the public by translating technical material into terms which may be easily understood by average community members who may not have sophisticated technical backgrounds but who are interested in how Holloman's IRP and RCRA corrective action program affect them. Several of the activities that may be undertaken by Holloman AFB to accomplish this are discussed below.

√ *Create a Stakeholder's Guide to the Documents in the Holloman AFB Information Repository*

It may be extremely daunting to a stakeholder to go to the library to review IRP and RCRA corrective action program information about Holloman and find over 800 technical documents. Holloman AFB will evaluate the possibility of developing a guide which would assist a community member in looking at as much information as he or she chooses. This guide could take the form of annotation added to the extant list. The annotation could explain simply, with no jargon, the contents of each of the documents available for public review within the information repository. An alternative approach might involve ordering or grouping the extant list and documents according to issue (e.g., general overview of IRP and RCRA corrective action program, materials specifically relevant to particular IRP and RCRA corrective action program projects, etc.).

√ *Expand the Mailing List*

Holloman AFB will evaluate the possibility of expanding the mailing list to include additional citizens from the Holloman residential population and the surrounding community. One way to do this may be to place an advertisement in one or more local newspapers soliciting the names and addresses of persons interested in receiving notices about community meetings and fact sheets about IRP and RCRA corrective action program activities. Holloman AFB will evaluate the possibility of sponsoring an information booth equipped with fact sheets or other printed material at joint community events such as town parades or Community Appreciation Day.

√ *Coordinate with On-Base Communication Networks*

Holloman AFB will evaluate the possibility of including IRP and RCRA corrective action program information on the agenda of one or more of the quarterly Town Meetings chaired by the Wing Commander. This would bring IRP and RCRA corrective action program issues to the attention of the base residential population.

Another possibility that will be evaluated is coordinating a Town Meeting with a community-wide meeting in an effort to involve stakeholders both on and off base in a community-wide dialog about the IRP and RCRA corrective action program.

Holloman AFB will also evaluate the possibility of modifying the Housing Brochure to include educational information about domestic environmental issues such as recycling, asbestos, lead based paint, disposal of household materials (such as bleach, detergents, etc.), and appropriate disposal of spent motor oil.

√ *News Releases to Base and off-Base Newspapers, Radio, and Television*

Holloman AFB should take greater advantage of the receptivity of the local print, radio, and television media to receiving more frequent news releases. Holloman AFB will evaluate the possibility of sending the various media copies of all fact sheets distributed to the general public. This would be one way of keeping the media up-to-date with IRP and RCRA corrective action program developments so that when a newsworthy event or milestone is reached, there will be a greater appreciation of its significance and consequently more accurate and extensive coverage for the public. Appendix D contains the News Media List which would be used for disseminating information to the public.

6.0 SCHEDULE OF COMMUNITY RELATIONS ACTIVITIES

Community relations activities will be organized by Holloman AFB to address the public's interest in IRP and RCRA corrective action program activities at the base, particularly those identified in Section 4.0. Community relations activities scheduled to overlap ongoing IRP and RCRA corrective action program activities are presented in Table 6-1. During the IRP and RCRA corrective action program, Holloman AFB will evaluate community relations activities and revise them, if necessary, to further meet community needs. Revisions to the schedule will be sent to the information repository and sent to community members on the mailing list.

APPENDIX B COMMUNITY RELATIONS PLAN INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

Interviews conducted in preparation of this CRP were conducted by telephone by personnel from Ebasco Services. Conversations were held between June 7 and June 15, 1995. All interviewees were asked generally the same questions. Sometimes discussions were expanded to additional topics as was appropriate to either the flow of the conversation or to the position of the interviewee. The topics and questions covered were as follows:

- Describe the environmental concerns which local citizens share regarding Holloman AFB.
- Are you aware of Holloman AFB's Installation Restoration Program? If so, how did you hear about it?
- What are the best channels which Holloman AFB could use to communicate with the public about its Installation Restoration Program (e.g. community meetings, newspapers, radio, television)?
- How many families live on Holloman AFB? What types of communication channels exist on the Base already? Can these be used to communicate with the residents about environmental issues at Holloman?
