Hello Adria,

NMED has received and reviewed your email requesting to postpone development of any of the monitoring, extraction, and injection wells for the EDB Bioremediation Pilot Test. The justification for the postponement is reasonable on the technical basis of preventing active drilling from interfering with well development. NMED understands that drilling is currently ongoing and therefore will likely have an impact on the development of the wells.

The postponement of well development of the groundwater monitoring, extraction, and injection wells is approved by NMED as long as the Air Force has properly notified and coordinated with the Office of the State Engineer to meet their requirements for timing and duration of well development.

Subject: Requesting NMED Approval for Development Postpone of Monitoring, Extraction, and Injection Wells for EDB Bioremediation Pilot Test Work Plan

Hi Diane,

The Air Force and CB&I would like to get permission from New Mexico Environment Department to postpone development of any of the wells (monitoring, extraction, and injection) until all active drilling is complete. Active drilling will likely be complete in mid-February, this delay in development will not cause any issues with the quality of development and/or the functionality of the well.

In discussions with our driller and with our internal experts, we determined that attempting development at a well that is very close to active drilling (i.e. within the ethylene dibromide bioremediation pilot test area) would cause interference with the development and will likely cause poor or incomplete development of the wells. Air rotary casing hammer drilling will artificially increase the water level and rise within the test area which will affect development.
