### Two Opportunities for Public to Meet with Advisory Committees: July 25 and August 2, 4

**Monday, July 25, 7:30-9 pm,  
at Fuller Lodge in Los Alamos**

We were just notified that the Environmental Safety and Health Panel of the University of California President's Council on the National Laboratories will meet in Los Alamos on July 24, 25, and 26 to review environmental safety and health issues at Los Alamos National Laboratory.

Stakeholders may meet panel members on **July 25, 7:30 to 9:00 pm at Fuller Lodge** in Los Alamos. At this meeting, panel members and stakeholders will discuss informally environmental, safety, and health (ES&H) issues.

At other times during the three-day visit, panel members will hear presentations at the Laboratory on radiological issues, the site-wide environmental impact statement, human studies, oversight issues, and other topics related to environmental safety and health. Tours of the Laboratory and a meeting with tribal government representatives are scheduled.

The University of California President's Council on the National Laboratories advises the President on all matters that relate to the management and operation of Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory, Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory, and Los Alamos National Laboratory. It also serves as a source of advice and counsel to the Laboratory directors, who have opportunities to call upon the expertise of the Council as a whole or of its individual members.

The primary role of the panel is to ensure that Laboratory operations comply with all applicable ES&H regulations so that Laboratory workers, the public, and the environment are protected. The panel's charge emphasizes environmental issues, especially those concerning compliance with federal, state, and local regulations. The panel also is part of the University of California's efforts to assess the Laboratory's performance in ES&H-related issues.

According to the Federal Register (July 13, 1994), a meeting of the Inertial Confinement Fusion Advisory Committee/Defense Programs will be held in Los Alamos, August 2-4. An opportunity for public comment is scheduled for August 2 at 5:45 pm. The public also may attend the meeting on August 4 from 5:00 pm until adjournment.

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before 3:00 pm (eastern standard time) on Thursday, July 28. Oral presenters should provide 25 copies of their statements at the time of presentation.

The committee provides advice and guidance to the Assistant Secretary for Defense Programs on technical and management aspects of the Inertial Confinement Fusion program.

The purpose of the meeting is to assess the technical applicability and readiness of the Inertial Confinement Fusion program to support the Defense Program's Stockpile Stewardship Program Strategy and the National Security Strategic Plan. In addition, the committee will identify and evaluate the significance of each element of the Inertial Confinement Fusion program.
