Dear Mr. Valencia:

The Environmental Improvement Division (EID) appreciates the laboratory's desire to provide a comprehensive and detailed trial burn report for the incinerator. We further understand the possible delays in receiving analytical results. However, the raw data, pursuant to HWMR-3, Section 302.E.2.b.(7), is required to be submitted within 90 days from the completion date of the trial burn. EID has placed the highest priority on processing LANL's RCRA permit application. We expect to have a draft permit for DOE and the public to review in 1987. Any excessive delay in receipt of the trial burn data will directly impact the permitting schedule; therefore, a final trial burn report needs to be submitted on, or before, March 8, 1987.
