

**SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF MAY 22, 1996, RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT & DEMONSTRATION PERMIT FOR THE PACKED BED REACTOR/SILENT DISCHARGE PLASMA TREATMENT UNIT PUBLIC MEETING**

A public meeting for the Research, Development & Demonstration Permit for the Packed Bed Reactor/Silent Discharge Plasma Treatment Unit was held on May 22, 1996, at the Los Alamos Inn, Los Alamos, New Mexico, from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. The primary purpose of this public meeting was to inform the public about the Los Alamos National Laboratory's request to the New Mexico Environment Department to make changes to the emergency contingency plan, the carbon filter unit, the building ventilation requirements and maps and figures that reflect the movement of the treatment unit to a new building location.

The following forms of advertising were used to publicize the public meeting:

- public notices were published in four local newspapers;
- a total of 2,000 notices were mailed to our stakeholders; and,
- four local document repositories were provided copies of the requests for the permit modification.

The meeting was canceled at 7:00 pm since public representatives did not attend. Marja Shaner from the Laboratory's Community Involvement and Outreach Office would have begun the meeting by welcoming everyone and introducing Tony Grieggs, a representative for the Hazardous & Solid Waste Group. Tony would have provided a brief overview and history of the Packed Bed Reactor/Silent Discharge Plasma Treatment Unit. Richard Korzekwa, an Electrical Engineer from Chemical Science & Technology Division, was also prepared to discuss the Class 2 permit modifications.



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
