Dear Messrs. Glenn and Watkins:

On March 30, 2007, the New Mexico Environment Department (**NMED**) received Los Alamos National Laboratory's (**LANL's**) 2007 Request for Four Class 2 Permit Modifications to the Los Alamos National Laboratory Hazardous Waste Facility Permit No. NM890010515-1, dated March 29, 2007.

According to 20.4.1.900 NMAC (incorporating 40 CFR §270.42(b)(6)), NMED must take specific action on the modification request no later than ninety (90) days after receipt of the request. In this instance, the date for a decision would be June 28, 2007. By this letter, I am notifying you as the Permittees that NMED is granting itself a 30-day extension and will decide on this modification request no later than 120 days after receipt of the modification, as allowed by 20.4.1.900 NMAC (incorporating §270.42(b)(6)(ii)).



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
