The New Mexico Environment Department (the Department) has received the 45 day On-site Investigation Report for the above-referenced site and has determined that the site does not pose a threat to human health or the environment as a result of the petroleum hydrocarbon release for the following reasons:

1. The vertical and horizontal extent of petroleum hydrocarbon contamination has been adequately defined.
2. The vertical extent of contamination is greater than 875 feet above the high static ground water level at the site.
3. Petroleum contaminated soils from the UST and line excavation and the dispenser island have been removed and disposed of properly.

Based on the information submitted, the Department requires no additional work at this site at this time regarding the UST release, although it reserves the right to do so should petroleum hydrocarbon contamination resulting in a threat to human health or the environment is discovered. Please be advised however that the presence of Acetone and other chlorinated solvents whose origin is non-UST related is subject to jurisdiction by the Department's Hazardous and Radioactive Materials Bureau (HRMB).
