The Disposal Pit at TD Site on Two Mile Mesa was a bulldozed trench some 50' wide by 20' deep at deepest point and sloping up to ground level at each end, with the overall length some 100' to 150'. It was prepared for use by any organization having non-explosive and non-radioactive classified materials to dispose of. There were many tons of metal parts, concrete mock-ups, handling fixtures, etc., but so far as I know there were no hazardous placed there. However, so far as I know there were no photographic or other records kept of this pit.

I left LASL Feb. '47 and up to that time there were no disposal areas on Two Mile Mesa for HE or radioactive waste. I had no control of radioactive materials, but it was our rule that no HE be disposed of by burying.

It was our intention that the pit be for classification protection only and after a number of years it could be declassified and the ground returned to public use.

I trust the above may be of some help.
