SUBJECT: REVIEW OF PRELIMINARY DRAWINGS: "MATERIALS DISPOSAL AREAS"

In response to your memorandum of May 25, 1964 we offer the following comments:

- 1743 7/21
1. Preservation of Indian Ruins - We do not believe that wire enclosures are necessary unless they are required by other authorities.
 2. Specifications for warning signs at disposal areas should originate with H-1 and/or H-3. The procurement and installation of such signs is an ENG-4 function.
 3. It does not appear that further information is needed beyond that incorporated in Drawing ENG-R-3639.
 4. It would seem desirable to repeat references on each print because individual prints may be issued for a particular job.
 5. On Drawing ENG-R-3642 the Pit Station Marker Signs seem clear and correct. It may be possible to include shaft depths and diameters in the Typical Shaft Diagram.
 6. There is a covered shallow trench in Area B (ENG-R-3641) which was used for the disposal of hazardous materials. The trench was three feet in depth, two feet wide and about 40 feet long. It lies parallel to the south fence line E140 + 00 and below line N92 + 50. It extends about half the distance to E142 + 50.
 7. Include on ENG-R-3642 a reference to H-3 letter dated 22 May 1964 which concerns the Chemical Pit.
