TA-21 - In addition to Materials Disposal Area A, the area embraced by Seepage Pits 1, 2, 3, 4, and the included land where proposed pits may be dug, should certainly be recorded and designated as a Materials Disposal Area. The same is true of pits adjoining TA-21-164. Further, the fenced area to the west of Area A and containing the tank farm 40-107-108 should also be recorded and designated.

The three Laundry Pits, south of the old contaminated laundry are questionable. The area is within the 1,500 ft. radius of DP Site, so should never be released. Quantities of radioactive materials released to this area were not great, and at the present time they have been bulldozed over.

Borings with an auger in the area with analysis of the soils should be made the next time we schedule a U.S.G.S. auger to Los Alamos.

TA-35 - The tank farm area should be recorded and designated a Materials Disposal Area.

SUBJECT: DESIGNATION OF ADDITIONAL MATERIALS DISPOSAL AREAS: TA-21 AND TA-35

Recent discussions with Dean Meyer and C. W. Christenson regarding the construction of a new disposal pit in the leaching bed area north of Building DP-35, TA-21, revealed that H-Division personnel were under the impression that this area, as well as the area that surrounds DP-164, were considered disposal areas. It was their recommendation that these two areas plus the leaching bed area south of the old DP laundry, and the tank farm area at the east end of TA-35, now be recorded and designated as Material Disposal Areas.

It will be appreciated if you would define the limits you propose for each of these four new disposal area on the attached prints of TA-21 and TA-35 and return them to this office in order that identification letters may be assigned, the areas monumented, and record drawings prepared.

In the event other areas are known to exist which should be so identified, please advise so that we may take similar action.
