**Subject:** meeting summary Los Alamos landfill and rubble pile closures

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Ray Sisneros, Butch Tongate, Richard Powell, Lee Winn, Debby Brinkerhoff and I met on 5/25/01 in the SWB conerence room to discuss the closure plan for the Los Alamos County landfill and rubble pile. Ray, the Los Alamos County Solid Waste Division Director, said his the third extension on his special use permit is going to expire on September 30, 2001 and he would like to try to get approval of the closure plan that he submitted June 7, 1999, before it expires.

After a discussion of the issues involved, Lee Winn said she would have to check with Neelam Dhawan, but suggested that the next step, as she saw it, would be to have LANL formally propose to do another Sampling and Analysis Plan on the SWMU's relating to the landfill, to characterize the nature and extent of the contaminants in the SWMU's found in the prior sampling in 1994. These results could be put into a followup report to the February 29, 1996 RCRA Facility Investigation Report and forwarded to HWB with a remediation plan that might include some interim measures to clean up hot spots that were in concentrations above regulatory concern and isolate any residual contaminants under 10 feet of soil. Several of the SWMU's related to the landfill were proposed for a No Further Action status but the requests were denied, possibly for lack of sufficient data on the nature and extent of the contamination.

Butch encouraged Ray to work directly with the HWB to get the SWMU issues resolved. Ray asked Butch to talk to James Bearzi about making resolution of the issues a priority. Richard asked about the status of the violations of the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan. Ray said he would check and get back to him on it, but thought they were incompliance. Rusty said that the approved interim measures on the SWMU's would need to be included in the closure plan before it could be approved. Ray said he would try to get LANL to submit the needed plans.

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
