On September 2, 1993, from 9:00 a.m. until 10:40 a.m., HRMB staff met with PNM and SJCAC representatives at the SJCAC office in Albuquerque. The meeting was held to update SJCAC on groundwater contamination investigation and remediation status at PNM.

SJCAC explained that their mission is to empower their community to solve their own problems. They stated that the purpose of the meeting with HRMB and PNM was to obtain background information on

and the status of the investigations at PNM. At the request of SJCAC, PNM and HRMB staff discussed the following information:

- history of the release from the RCRA unit at PNM
- regulatory history of the RCRA unit at PNM
- history of hazardous waste regulations
- results and current status of groundwater contamination investigations
- proposed remediation
- special concerns of the community
- process for public involvement at PNM

D. Herrera asked for information on the history of public involvement. Historic public notice in 1986 was described as including announcements in newspapers, on radios, and by direct mailing to the list of interested parties maintained by HRMB permitting. D. Herrera requested that SJCAC be placed on the mailing list.

At the request of SJCAC, HRMB staff stayed for further discussions following the departure of PNM representatives. SJCAC will use the information provided to assist their organization in directing their resources towards efforts that will be of greatest benefit to their constituency. SJCAC made two specific requests. First, they recommend public notice in Spanish language newspapers and on Spanish language radio stations in Albuquerque. Second, as a courtesy, they would like NMED to allow them to read, and provide input to, public notice announcements of concern to their constituency.
