

In accordance with the Philips Semiconductors' Part B Permit, NMD000709782, this letter serves as certification of waste minimization activities for the time period between September 1, 1994, and August 31, 1995. During this time period, approximately 230 tons of hazardous waste were generated. This waste was handled by fuels substitution, incineration, and regeneration in order to minimize the impact on the environment today and in the future. The following chart shows a breakdown of the treatment methods used on the hazardous waste generated.



In the future, we plan to investigate recycling opportunities while continuing to look at ways to reduce waste generation at the source. As always, Philips is committed to protecting the environment!
