Enclosed please find two copies of Philips Semiconductors response to the NMED's September 24, 2004 Request for Supplemental Information regarding the RCRA Facility Investigation (RFI) Report for SWMU #8, Former Coronado Municipal Landfill. In response to the NMED Request for Supplemental Information the requested clarifications, minor modifications, and additional sampling data have been provided.

With submittal of this response to the Request for Supplemental Information, Philips Semiconductors considers the RFI Report for SWMU #8, Former Coronado Municipal Landfill to be finalized. Submittal of this report is in partial fulfillment of the terms of RCRA Permit #NMD000709782, Module IV.

It is also assumed that based on the limited number of issues noted in the Request for Supplemental Information that the NMED is generally in concurrence with Philips' proposal of No Further Action for SWMU #8. It is Philips' understanding that the next step in this process will likely be the NMED issuing a letter stating that the Department finds SWMU #8 appropriate for No Further Action petition. At that point the formalized process for a No Further Action Petition can be initiated.
