
**RE: Closure Plan Document Availability**

## CLOSURE PLAN FACT SHEET

for the

HAZARDOUS WASTE UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK SYSTEM  
Safety Kleen Service Center

March 26, 1993

**Activities:** Closure of a hazardous waste underground storage tank (UST) system at the Safety Kleen (SK) Service Center under the New Mexico Hazardous Waste Act.

**Facility Name:** Safety Kleen Corp.

**EPA ID Number:** NMD000804294

**Location:** The SK Corp. Service Center is located at 2720 Girard NE, Albuquerque, New Mexico. The storage tank system is located at the site.

**Pre-closure Activities:** The underground tank system to be closed consists of one 12,000 gallon steel UST used for storage of spent mineral spirits and sludge, associated piping, and appurtenances; and a two-bay return and fill station with two wet dumpsters (capacity 375 gallons each); and one 12,000 gallon steel UST used for storage of product mineral spirits, associated piping, and appurtenances. SK conducted site assessment activities at the units in October 1991 and in January-February 1992 in response to a release from the product mineral spirits UST feedline. Subsurface investigations indicate low level concentrations of contamination in the soils.

**Closure of Facility:** Proposed closure of the UST system includes excavation, decontamination, and proper disposal of the steel structures, associate piping, and appurtenances. The plan calls for a subsoils and ground water investigation to determine the extent and concentrations of any subsurface contamination. Any contamination identified will be removed or decontaminated to concentrations that will not harm human health or the environment.

**Closure plan**

**Availability:** A copy of the closure plan and the proposed Conditions for Closure Plan Approval is available for public review at the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) Hazardous and Radioactive Materials Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87502, and at the Albuquerque Main Public Library, 501 Copper Avenue, N.W., Albuquerque, New Mexico 87102.

**Comment Period  
and Request**

**for Hearing:** Any person including SK, who wishes to comment on the tentative decision to approve the closure plan, or who wishes to request a public hearing may do so by submitting written comments or requests to the NMED Hazardous and Radioactive Materials Bureau, P.O. Box 26110, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87502, ATTENTION: Mr. Marc Sides. Any request for hearing shall state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing and must include the requestor's name and address. Only comments and requests for public hearing received by April 26, 1993 will be considered.

**Final**

**Decision:** All comments submitted on this proposed closure plan will be considered in formulating a final decision. The NMED will notify SK and each person who submitted a written comment during the public comment period, of the final decision, or of any public hearing which may be scheduled. The final decision will require that closure activities be conducted in accordance with applicable State and Federal laws, as well as with the terms approved in the closure plan. Interim status will be terminated upon the NMED's acceptance of SK's demonstration of clean closure of the unit.
