Dear Mr. Cochran:

The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) has reviewed the February 11, 2019, "Request for Permit Modification to the Facility's Part B Permit" submitted by Safety-Kleen Systems, Inc., on behalf of J.D Kinsey and Joy M. Kinsey, the Owners, and itself, the Operator (collectively the Permittees) of the Farmington Container and Tank Storage Center (the Facility). NMED received the request for permit modification on February 20, 2019. In the submittal the Permittees requested for changes to be made to the current Operating Permit Part A Application to update the Facility Permit Contact.

In the request, the Permittees specifically proposed replacing Ms. Nahid Toossi, formerly the Senior Environmental Health and Safety Manager, with Mr. Nicholas T. Culian, Jr., Senior Environmental Compliance Manager, as the Facility Permit Contact.

Following review of the Permit modification proposal, the NMED determined that it is a Class 1 Permit Modification not requiring NMED approval.

Since the Permit Modification is a self-implementing change that does not require approval from

NMED, the Permittees must send a notice of the modification to all persons on the facility mailing list previously received from the NMED. The notification must be made within 90 calendar days after the change is put into effect.

The Permittees must also incorporate the attached updated Part A Permit Application into the current operating permit, upon receipt of this letter.


Further, the New Mexico Hazardous Waste Management Fee Regulations 20.4.2 NMAC require assessment of fees when administrative review of a document is complete. NMED has attached an invoice to this letter. Payment of the fees is due within sixty (60) calendar days from the date that you receive the invoice.

If payment is by check, then you must provide the invoice number on the check. If payment is transmitted electronically, then you must submit a letter to Mr. Brian Holton, NMED Hazardous Waste Bureau, indicating the invoice number, payment amount, and the assessed activity prior to transferring funds.

Should the Permittees need to request an extension of the sixty-day period the request must be submitted at least seven days prior to the end of the sixty-day period. Should the Permittees disagree with the fee assessed you may file an Administrative Appeal under the provisions of 20.4.2.302 NMAC.
