I've sent the following email to James Kenney, StephanieStringer, Ohn Kieling, and Dave Cobain, all of NMED.

Greetings: I attended a presentation last evening about Sandia Lab's Mixed Waste Landfill. The presentation focused on three things: the rather hair-raising discussion of what was in that mixed waste landfill; the potential for various untoward incidents; the impending, if not already happening, contamination of the aquifer.
That last point is what drives me to write this email.
The presentation included some good news and some bad news. The good news is Sandia Labs has recognized the danger of the landfill and has recommended "excavation with offsite disposal."
The bad news is they can't proceed without an order from you all -- and you haven't given that order!
My question is: what in the world are you waiting for?
Unless the oil and gas industry or some other big money outfit has some vested interest in keeping this landfill the way it is, the decision seems like a no-brainer.
Please issue the order.
