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RECOGNIZING AN IMMINENT AND SUBSTANTIAL ENDANGERMENT RELATED TO

CONTAMINATION IN THE VICINITY OF THE SPARTON TECHNOLOGY SITE AT 9621
COORS ROAD NW, ALBUQUERQUE; DECLARING THE CITY'S COMPELLING
INTEREST IN PROTECTING THE CITY'S WATER RESOURCES; CALLING UPON STATE
AND FEDERAL AUTHORITIES TO ACT IMMEDIATELY TO REQUIRE RESPONSIBLE
PARTIES TO CHARACTERIZE AND ABATE THE IMMINENT AND SUBSTANTIAL
BUDANGERMENT; AND, CALLING FOR INDEPENDENT PROGRAMMATIC AND LEGAL

ACTION BY THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE.

WHEREAS, hazardous industrial solvent wastes and hazardous metal plating wastes were disposed of at the property and facility owned and operated by Sparton Technology located at 9621 Coors Road N.W., Albuquerque, New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, investigations at the Sparton Technology site demonstrate that the hazardous wastes, including the constituents trichloroethylene (TCE) and chromium, are present in the soil and continue to be released into groundwater; and

WHEREAS, the demonstrated concentrations of hazardous wastes present in soil and groundwater at the Sparton site greatly exceed safe levels established by the State of New Mexico and the United States government; and

WHEREAS, investigations at the Sparton site demonstrate that the release of contamination from the Sparton site is continuous, has migrated off the Sparton property, has migrated beyond the farthest and deepest monitoring wells, and that the contamination is uncontrolled and continues to spread; and

WHEREAS, the hazardous wastes emanating from the Sparton site threaten to contaminate a unique hydrogeological structure known as a "recharge window"; and

WHEREAS, the aquifer impacted and endangered by the Sparton contamination is master planned as the location of the Corrales Trunk Primary Well Field and as such

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is a critical resource	for	the	City	of	Albud	querque;	and
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2 WHEREAS, the Groundwater Protection Policy and Action Plan adopted by the 3 City designates the area impacted and endangered by the Sparton contamination as

4 a crucial area for groundwater quality protection; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Groundwater Protection Policy and Action Plan adopted by the City is to ensure the quality of our groundwater resources so that the public health, quality of life, and economic vitality of this and future generations are not diminished; and

WHEREAS, the goals and policies of the Groundwater Protection Policy and Action Plan call for the City to identify responsible parties, to seek expeditious cleanup remedies, and to promote the vigorous enforcement of groundwater laws and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City's interests and rights in the development and use of the aquifer and recharge window are damaged by the contamination released and emanating from the Sparton site; and

WHEREAS, protracted negotiations between Sparton Technology and the United States Environmental Protection Agency have not resulted in adequate characterization and abatement of the imminent and substantial endangerment.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE:

Section 1. The City finds:

A. That the contamination emanating from the Sparton facility presents an imminent and substantial endangerment to health or the environment.

B. That the City has a compelling interest in protecting the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens, including vigorous protection of the City's limited groundwater resources.

C. That the groundwater and recharge window in the vicinity of the Sparton facility comprises a valuable resource for the City, which the City intends to develop and utilize.

Section 2. The City calls upon the appropriate State and Federal authorities to act immediately to require the responsible parties to characterize and abate the imminent and substantial endangerment at the Sparton site.

Section 3. The Public Works Department and Environmental Health

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Department of the City shall take programmatic action to determine the best uses of the aquifer and recharge window in the vicinity of the Sparton facility.

Section 4. The City Attorney's Office shall take available legal action to establish independent standing to require responsible parties to characterize and abate the imminent and substantial endangerment at the Sparton facility, and to seek recovery of damages and costs to the City caused by the contamination.

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
