RE: Discharge Plan Required for Sparton Technology Inc. Coors Road Facility

Dear Mr. Mico:

This is in response to your January 30, 1997 notice of intent to discharge for the Sparton Technology Inc. Coors Road Facility. The notice was submitted to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) in accordance with Section 1201. "Notice of Intent to Discharge" of the NM Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC) Regulations, copy enclosed.

The information you have provided and any supplemental materials you may have submitted have been reviewed by the NMED. You are hereby notified that a discharge plan, as defined in WQCC Reg. 1101.N, is required for your proposed remediation system discharge to be located in Rio Rancho in Bernalillo County.

Enclosed are the necessary materials for the preparation of a discharge plan application. In addition, the filing of plans and specifications is required under WQCC Reg. 1202. Please mail three copies of your completed discharge plan and plans and specifications to the Program Manager, Ground Water Pollution Prevention Section, at the address listed above.

Plans and specifications should include a plot plan of the property which shows all buildings on the property, the location and size of all septic tanks and leach fields or other systems used for the treatment and discharge of waste water, and the location and size of all pipelines used for the conveyance and distribution of effluent with valves and distribution boxes as appropriate.

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You are advised that any discharge from this facility without prior approval from this office would be a violation of the WQCC Regulations. Before discharging you must have either a discharge plan approved by the NMED or temporary permission to discharge without an approved discharge plan. Temporary permission can only be granted for good cause shown by you and can only be for a nonrenewable period of up to 120 days.

Any appeal from this determination must be made to the New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission within 30 days, in accordance with WQCC Req. 3112.B.
