

Dear Mr. Huhn:

The purpose of this letter is to memorialize the telephone conversation that we had today regarding contamination resulting from past waste management practices by Sparton Technology, Inc. (Sparton) at their Coors Road facility in Albuquerque. Solvent disposal by Sparton in the past has resulted in a plume of ground water contamination that has spread from the facility in a west northwest direction. This contaminated water is not being utilized by any water system and does not pose an ingestion hazard to any member of the public.

In addition, homes located over the existing plume are not subject to any health hazard from the contamination. Contaminated vapors are not found at the ground surface outside of the Sparton facility and so there is no health threat posed by breathing the air, playing in the dirt or eating vegetables grown in this area.
