**RE: Administrative Inadequacy of Permit Application**

The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) Hazardous and Radioactive Materials Bureau (HRMB) has reviewed for administrative completeness, the November 1994 Gandy/Marley Inc.'s (GMI) Triassic Park Hazardous Waste Disposal facility permit application as required under the New Mexico Hazardous Waste Management Regulations.

After reviewing the permit application, the NMED has found the application to be administratively deficient. The following is the deficiency that GMI must be addressed before the application can be deemed administratively complete.

Provide a third party executable comprehensive list of the waste on revised page 6 of the Part A Permit Application. This means instead of writing "D series", submit the name of the waste, for example (D009), mercury, including the amount of each respective waste type. This should enable a non hazardous waste person to understand the proposed waste to be disposed of in the subject landfill.

After submission of the above required information, HRMB may declare the application administratively complete. If HRMB finds the application administratively complete, GMI will be assessed a New Mexico Hazardous Waste Permit Fees, the payment of which will be followed by technical review of the subject application.

After submission of the above required information, HRMB may

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declare the application administratively. If HRMB finds the application dministratively complete, GMI will be assessed a New Mexico Hazardous Waste Management Fees, the payment of which will be followed by technical review of the subject application.

The information requested in the attachment must be submitted to HRMB within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this NOD. Failure to submit the required information in this designated time may result in a Notice of Intent to Deny (NOID) a Permit being sent to you, followed by permit denial.
