Our designation policy is if the waste is designated with a federal waste code and is not being disposed of in Washington State we do not apply the Washington State waste codes. The only case where a Washington State code would be applied is if we did not have a listed federal code (U, P, F and K) and it was federally regulated for a characteristic federal code only we would apply a WSC2 code if it was a corrosive solid and if applicable a D003 State only waste code.

Could you confirm or deny that for mixed transuranic waste, once Federal Hazardous Waste Numbers ("listed" or "characteristic") have been assigned to the waste, further designation for Washington State dangerous waste criteria is not required according to current Hanford waste designation policy?

I am trying to resolve a question concerning the difference in waste designations over the past twenty-five years or so. Some of the older designations have applied both Washington DW numbers and Federal HWNs.
