Late this afternoon, the New Mexico Environment Department was informed that the breakdown of the locations of the 6 drums are ***not*** located as originally reported to us, which was 3 at LANL, 2 at WCS and the 1 breached drum at WIPP. In fact, upon reevaluation by DOE, there are 5 at WCS in Texas, 0 at LANL, and the 1 breached drum at WIPP.

Just want to update for you.

This came from Pete Maggorie, who got it from Wallace, so it's as confirmed as it gets.

I have called all the media who were there today and informed them of the change, and they have all responded they now have the new updated numbers.
