Re: PUBLIC NOTICE No. 20-03 - New Shaft at the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant

Dear Mr. Maestas,

It is imperative that you withdraw the current Temporary Authorization (TA) that allowed the drilling of the Utility "ventilation" shaft at WIPP without a complete public process.

It is your job as WIPP Group Manager to protect the land and people of New Mexico.

It is also your job to ensure the required public participation requirements are met in a non-discriminatory manner. The Public Involvement Plan (PIP) is incomplete. The Public Notice does not notify the public about how they can access language services for Low English Proficiency speakers. The Fact Sheet does not state that DOE is digging the shaft NOW!

It is clear that this TA and the Department of Energy (DOE) permit application to continue operations indefinitely at WIPP put all New Mexicans and our enchanted homelands at severe risk.


You must not allow New Mexico to become the nation's nuclear dumping ground; as no other permanent repository has been created.
