

SUBJECT: Appointment to the PAC on WIPP


Janet Greenwald asked that we add the following biography for Dr. Harvey Harris to the list of potential candidates that she furnished earlier in the week:

✓ Mr. Roger Anderson - 358-3487  
Albuquerque, URM Geology Department

Professor of geology for 30 years, past consultant on WIPP to IDA (2 years ago) and Sandia Labs (5 years ago), presently a member of the scientific review panel for the Palo Duro basin nuclear waste site (Deaf Smith County). His position has been that the WIPP site is not a good choice for permanent radioactive waste disposal.

Max Coll - 982-0952

state legislator for 12 years (non consecutive terms), a lawyer with a degree in chemistry. His position on WIPP has been one of concern, mostly focusing on safety issues.

✓ John Gonzales - 287-0371

Secretary/Treasurer AIA Indian Pueblo Council, works on the environmental concerns of the council. Mr. Gonzales has had no previous relationship to WIPP.

Retired radiologist, member of Physicians for Social Responsibility. Dr. Weisberg has served off and on as a technical advisor to CARD for the last three years. Dr. Weisberg is opposed to the WIPP project on the basis of poor geology at the site and the experimental nature of the proposed transportation. Lives in Santa Fe.
