## NOTICE OF WIPP PUBLIC MEETING

Notice is hereby given that the New Mexico Radioactive Waste Consultation Task Force (Governor's WIPP Task Force), Section 74-4A-6 NMSA 1978, will hold a public meeting in Room 321 of the State Capitol Building in Santa Fe (located at the corner of Old Santa Fe Trail and Paseo de Peralta), beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, July 14, 1995. The Task Force is composed of the Governor's cabinet secretaries of the Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, Environment Department, Department of Health, Department of Public Safety, Taxation and Revenue Department, and the State Highway and Transportation Department, or their designees. The powers and duties of the Task Force are set out at Section 74-4A-7 NMSA 1978. A primary purpose of the meeting is to provide a forum and solicit public input on issues relating to the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP), a nuclear waste repository intended for the permanent disposal of defense transuranic radioactive waste. Included on the agenda are status reports by the U.S. Department of Energy, the Environmental Evaluation Group, State agencies, and others on current WIPP issues and activities.
