Dear Hope,

The downstream sample was not included in the original "Monitoring and Contingency Plan" from August 2004.

An e-mail from Wayne Price dated September 29, 2004 requested downstream samples be taken after he expressed concern that the August samples showed hits of hydrocarbon. At that time, downstream samples were grabbed and analyzed for constituents of concern – TPH (8015 DRO and GRO), and BTEX/MTBE (8021B).

Subsequent River Sampling events included the downstream sample point, which was again analyzed for BTEX/MTBE and TPH. The next sampling event is scheduled for December. At that time, Giant will sample and analyze the downstream point for all the constituents mentioned in the "Monitoring and Contingency Plan" from August 2004.
