Bloomfield has two drum storage areas, the Warehouse yard, and the North Bone Yard. New drums are stored in the Warehouse Yard and the North Bone Yard is used for the storage of empty drums only.

The Warehouse Yard is where the new construction took place in 1988. A drum storage shed, including concrete flooring, curbing, and covering was constructed in the Warehouse Yard only. The North Bone Yard was cleaned up and now only used for the storage of empty drums.

Bloomfield has made an effort to reduce the use of materials in drums and where possible uses bulk storage devices.

I have been looking at the SWMU Assessment Report, December 2003. I need some clarification for SWMU No. 2 Former Drum Storage Area.

In the report if you go to SWMU 2, the first page provides a description of the SWMU. Under the North Bone Yard section it states "In April of 1988, BRC upgraded the drum storage areas and constructed the drum storage shed, concrete flooring and collection trough with covering 3 sides." Did this also occur at the Warehouse Yard or just the North Bone Year?

According to the page description, Giant currently has two drum storage areas, 1. the North Bone Yard that stores empty drums and 2. the Warehouse Yard that stores drums containing materials used in the refinery processes.

Please verify if I have interpreted this section correctly.
