The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) has completed its review of the Marathon Petroleum Company LP dba Western Refining Southwest Inc., Gallup Refinery (the Permittee) April 4, 2019 *Notice of Organizational Change* (Permit Modification). The NMED received the request for a permit modification on April 11, 2019.

Following review of the Permit Modification proposal, NMED has determined that it is a Class 1 Permit Modification not requiring Agency approval.

In the submittal, the Permittee proposed to make changes that reflect the ownership and organizational changes in the Facility RCRA Part A permit application (Part A). The revised Part A also includes updated listings of listed hazardous waste handled at the facility.

The Permittee must incorporate a copy of the modified RCRA Part A application into Attachment B of the RCRA Permit upon receipt of this letter.

Since the Permit Modification is a self-implementing change that does not require approval from NMED, the Permittee must, pursuant to 40 CFR §270.42(a)(ii), send out a notice of the Permit

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modification to all persons on the Facility mailing list previously received from the NMED. This notification must be made within 90 calendar days after the change is put into effect.


Further, the New Mexico Hazardous Waste Management Fee Regulations 20.4.2 NMAC require assessment of fees when administrative review of a document is complete. NMED has attached an invoice to this letter. Payment of the fees is due within sixty (60) calendar days from the date that you receive the invoice.

If payment is by check, then you must provide the invoice number on the check. If payment is transmitted electronically, then you must submit a letter to Mr. Brian Holton, NMED Hazardous Waste Bureau, indicating the invoice number, payment amount, and the assessed activity prior to transferring funds.

Should the Permittee need to request an extension of the sixty-day period the request must be submitted at least seven days prior to the end of the sixty-day period. Should the Permittee disagree with the fee assessed you may file an Administrative Appeal under the provisions of 20.4.2.302 NMAC.
